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RESOLUTION NUMBER 10372 CCS

(CITY COUNCIL SERIES)

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA MONICA  
REVISING WATER RATES AND WATER SERVICE CHARGES

WHEREAS, the City Council may establish, amend or revise from time to time by resolution the rates and service charges to be charged for supplying water service to any customer pursuant to Section 7.12.010 of the Santa Monica Municipal Code;

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Monica faces increased costs of providing water service to its customers;

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Monica wishes to encourage water conservation by revising the water rate structure; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Monica, in accordance with Article XIII D Section 6 of the California Constitution, mailed a notice of proposed water rate increases for a five-year period beginning August 1, 2008 through July 1, 2012 to the owner of record of each parcel in Santa Monica's service area and parcels in the City of Los Angeles who receive water service from the City of Santa Monica.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF SANTA MONICA DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As of August 1, 2008, or as soon thereafter practical, a four-tier water commodity rate structure for single-family customers for all meter sizes is hereby established as follows:

<u>Tier</u>	<u>Rate</u>	<u>Single Family Range of Use/HCF*</u>
1	\$1.65	0-14
2	\$2.47	15-40
3	\$3.70	41-148
4	\$5.78	149+

\* HCF = 100 cubic feet

Section 2. As of August 1, 2008, or as soon thereafter practical, a four-tier water commodity rate structure for multi-family customers for all meters sizes is hereby established as follows:

**Section 5.** As of August 1, 2008, or as soon thereafter practical, a fixed bi-monthly service charge for fireline meters is hereby established as follows:

Any unauthorized metered water usage for fireline meters will result in doubling of the service charge.

**Section 6.** A low-income allowance will be offered to residential water customers with individual water meters who qualify for the City's Utilities User Tax Exemption Program, the Southern California Gas Co. or the Southern California Edison low-income assistance programs. As of August 1, 2008, or as soon thereafter practical, the residential low-income water commodity charge is hereby established as follows:

Tier 1 \$0.96  
Tier 2 \$1.78  
Tier 3 \$3.01  
Tier 4 \$5.78

**Section 7.** The City will establish administrative remedies for those fourth tier customers who can demonstrate that they have taken all reasonable water efficiency measures to reduce water use but are still in the fourth tier. City

staff may perform a water audit for a customer and require the customer to implement recommendations before rate structure adjustments are made.

Section 8. Maximum rate increases from July 1, 2009 through July 1, 2012 are hereby established as follows:



July 1, 2012	10.0%

Section 9. Commencing upon July 1, 2013 and on July 1 of each fiscal year thereafter, fees established by this resolution shall be administratively revised annually by a factor equal to the difference in the Los Angeles-Anaheim-Riverside Consumer Price Index for Wage Earners and Clerical Workers for the twelve (12) month period February through February of the prior fiscal year.

Section 10. Resolution Number 10321(CCS) is hereby repealed in its entirety.



**City of Santa Monica BMP 4 Commodity Rates  
November 9, 2010**

**Since 1986, the City of Santa Monica has required and installed water meters for all new water service connections per Santa Monica Municipal Code 7.12.140.**

**7.12.140 Service connections and meters.**

(a) **New Services and Meters.** Each person desiring the installation of a new service and meter shall make application therefor in the form and manner prescribed by the Utilities Manager. The size of the service and meter shall be subject to approval by the City. If a water distribution main is available adjacent to the property, the Utilities Division shall install a service and meter at any reasonable location selected by the applicant. If a water distribution main is not available adjacent to the property, then the Utilities Division may either require the installation of a water main at the applicant's expense or may install a service and meter adjacent to the nearest available main, in which case it shall be the responsibility of the applicant to obtain easements and install necessary service lines to the property.

The charges for installing each new service and meter, which amount shall be paid in advance by the applicant, shall be as set from time to time by resolution of the City Council.

(b) **Changes in Location and/or Size.** When a change in location of an existing service and meter is requested by a property owner, or when a change in location is required by the City because of some act or omission of a property owner or customer, the charge, payable in advance, shall be the charge for installing a new service and meter.

When a decrease in size of an existing meter at the same location is requested by a property owner, the smaller meter shall be installed, provided that the requested meter is determined by the City to be of adequate size. The property owner shall pay a fee for this service which shall be established or amended by the City Council from time to time by resolution.

When a decrease in size of an existing meter at a different location is requested by a property owner, or when an increase in size of an existing meter at the same or a different location is requested or is required by the City, the charge, payable in advance, shall be the total installation and capital facility fee for the new size. In addition, with an increase in meter size, a capital facility fee of the difference between the new meter and old meter will be charged. With a decrease in meter size, no capital facility fee will be charged or credited to the fees payable.

(c) **Ownership of Services and Meters.** All services and meters shall be owned by the Utilities Division. The expense of maintenance repair and renewal due to normal wear and tear shall be borne by the Utilities Division except that expenses incurred by any act or omission on the part of the customer, or the customer's family, employees, agents or tenants shall be charged to the customer. All meters will be sealed by the Utilities Division at the time of installation and no seal should be altered or broken except by one of its authorized employees.

All connections to services and meters shall be in a manner prescribed by the Utilities Manager. Substandard connections or the installation of any private or non-Utilities Division materials within meter boxes or vaults shall be corrected or removed within thirty days of mailing of notice by registered mail to the owner of record of the water service. Failure to comply may result in discontinued service.

(d) **Removal or Abandonment of Services and/or Meters.** The Utilities Division reserves the right to remove or abandon any service and/or meter for which no person has made application and through which no water has legally passed during the preceding eighteen months. If the meter only is removed and the service left intact, and application is subsequently made for a meter of the same size, then the Utilities Division shall reset a meter. The charge, payable in advance, shall be the installation cost for that size meter. If the meter is removed and the service abandoned, and application is subsequently made for a meter of the same or different size, then the charge payable in advance, shall be the total installation cost and capital facility fees for the requested size.

(e) **Location of Water Meters.** Water meters shall be located in the public right-of-way. Existing meters not so located shall be relocated at the option of the Utilities Division which shall bear all costs for such relocations except those associated with the consumer's connection to the relocated meters. (Prior code § 7211; amended by Ord. No. 1385CCS, adopted 9/9/86; Ord. No. 1836CCS § 12, adopted 12/12/95)

The City of Santa Monica meets CUWCC BMP Requirements for BMP 5.

**Background**

Total Number of Dedicated Landscape Meters: 489

Number of City Managed Dedicated Landscape Meters: 418

**Audits and Water Budgets:**

Eighty-five percent of the dedicated meter landscaped areas are professionally managed by the City's Public Landscape Division. In 1994 the City received a grant from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California to audit and install a central weather-based irrigation control system at all of the City-owned parks and several open spaces, Santa Monica public schools and Santa Monica College. This central irrigation system uses local weather data to **automatically develop water budgets** for each site and to efficiently water these landscapes. In addition these landscapes include water-saving **rotors, rotary nozzles** for sprinklers and **drip** irrigation, as well as, **California native plants, Mediterranean plants, and drought-tolerant turf.**

In 2009 the City, in partnership with local landscape professionals, began auditing the City's parks. To date, 5 sites have been audited. The results were shared with the City's Public Landscape Division. As a result, adjustments to the irrigation systems have been made including installation of rotary nozzles for sprinklers and flow sensors that alert staff if a leak is detected.

**Incentives:**

Since 2004 the City of Santa Monica has awarded over \$600,000 in grants to property owners that convert water-thirsty lawns and gardens into sustainable landscapes that may include water-efficient irrigation, climate-appropriate plants, rain harvesting features, graywater systems, and permeable paving. These gardens meet the City's landscape standards which can reduce outdoor water use by a minimum of 50% compared to traditional gardens.

In October 2010 the City began offering additional rebates including a cash for grass program, irrigation product rebate, and a low-income customer irrigation product give-away.

**Ordinances:**

In 2008 the City Council adopted new landscape and irrigation requirements for all new and existing landscapes. This ordinance is more stringent than the State's Model Landscape Ordinance. New landscapes following these standards will use 50% less water; generate zero irrigation runoff; produce 50% less yard waste; and may reduce maintenance by 50%.


